

Our first Arts Council performance for the year will occur on Wednesday 29th March. Thanks to the generous support of our P&C all children in Prep to Year 6 will be able to attend the performance of Sticks & Stones completely free of charge to families.

'Sticks & Stones' is a live educational theatre performance that promotes resilience, cyber safety and positive connections. Children will attend the performance in three groups P-2 and 3-4 and 5-6.

This week we are going to take on the Yellow Zone. When we are in the Yellow Zone, we have more energy and our feelings are getting stronger, such as feeling excited, fidgety, anxious, or frustrated. Although our feelings are becoming more intense, we usually still have a sense of control when in the Yellow Zone.

Being in the Yellow Zone can be helpful when competing in a game, doing a school performance, or playing with friends because a higher energy/alertness helps us engage and perform in these activities.


We might decide to regulate our Yellow Zone when our goal is to complete an assignment, trying to rest, or study in a group. Having more control and calmer energy may be more effective in accomplishing our tasks and supporting our well-being in certain situations. Some examples of Yellow Zone tools that might help in these situations are taking some deep breaths, using a fidget, positive self-talk, and connecting with someone for support.

Everyone has a different set of tools that work for them. What are your Yellow Zone tools?

Also, don't forget ALL THE ZONES ARE OKAY! It is natural and anticipated that we will move through various Zones throughout the day.


